ON STATE STREET



HOURS:

State Street will be fenced off beginning at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, October 28. Between the hours of 7:30 p.m. on October 28 and 1:30 a.m. on October 29, anyone wishing to enter the fenced area will need to show a ticket and have their hand stamped. Once your hand is stamped, you may exit the fenced area and then re-enter up until 1:30 a.m. on Sunday, October 29 by showing your hand stamp to the gate attendants. Access into the event will be available through nine gates located from the Capitol Square to Lake Street.



TICKETS:

Ticket Cost: \$5

Thursday, October 26 & Friday, October 27: Advance ticket sales will be available at two locations:

- Ticket trailer located on the 700-block of State Street (Library Mall) 1 p.m. – 9 p.m..
- Parks Office, 215 MLK Jr. Blvd. during work hours, 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m..

Saturday, October 28: Tickets will be on sale the day of the event from 1 p.m. - close at the 700-block ticket trailer plus 3 additional booth locations along State Street.

Cash and local checks only. Limit 4 tickets. Tickets cannot be purchased online.



FOOD AND ENTERTAINMENT:

Food vendors will be available on the 700 block of State Street (Library Mall) on the day of the event. The Food Vending location will be open by 7 p.m..

The entertainment stages will be located near the Capitol Square and near the intersection of Gorham Street and State Street. There will be a variety of entertainment on the two stages. For more information on entertainment, visit HACMadison.com.



GENERAL RULES FOR ADMISSION:

No weapons including fake weapons or ones as part of your costume. Dangerous or inappropriate items, as determined by the police, will be confiscated. Leave them home.

No glass will be allowed on State Street. Those consuming alcohol in the establishments must be age 21 and have photo identification. Out-of-state residents will need two forms of identification. No alcohol is allowed on public property including streets, sidewalks, alleyways or in vehicles.



DRIVING DIRECTIONS AND TRANSPORTATION:

Follow Highway 12 (Beltline) to John Nolen Drive, exit 263. Take the exit for Broom Street, which leads to State Street. Please see map for street closing times and detours.

The use of taxis and public transportation is highly recommended, as parking in the downtown area will be very limited. Expect schedule and stop changes due to closing of State Street.

LODGING:

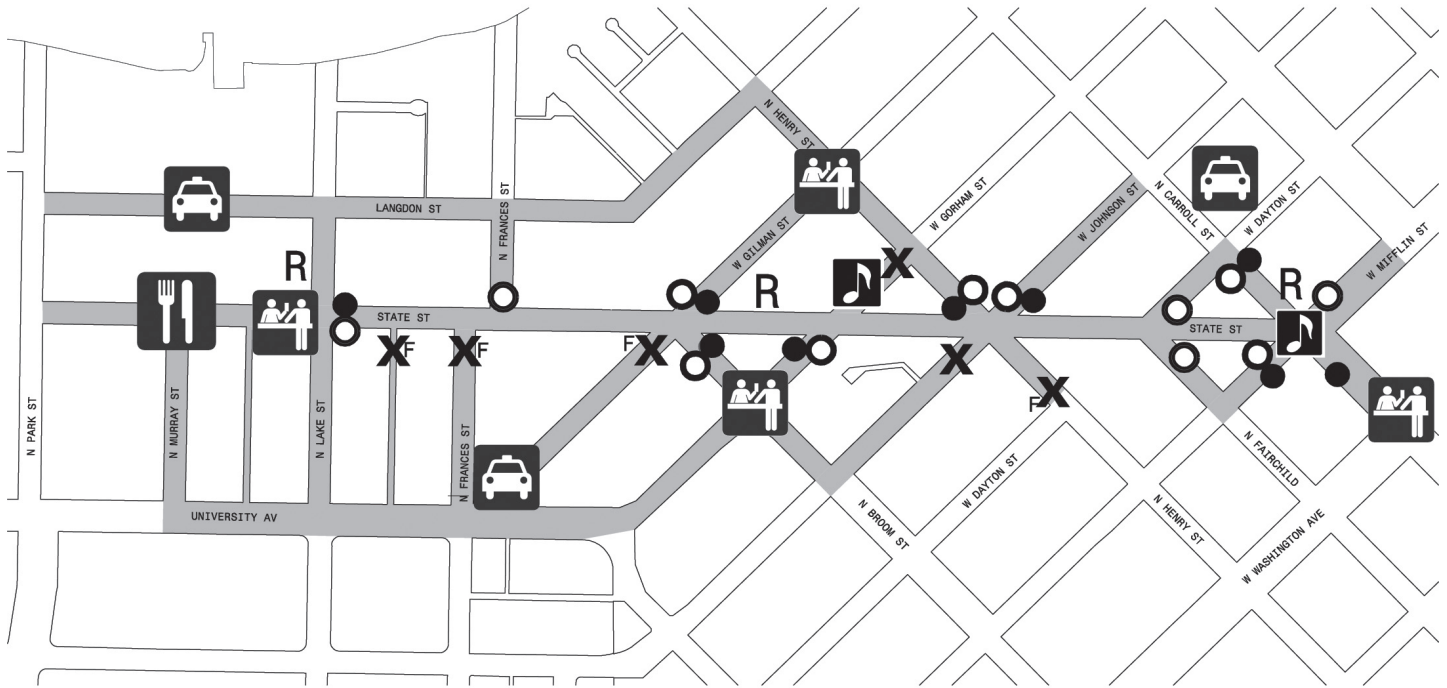
Please make arrangements to secure lodging before you arrive. Camping in city parks is prohibited. Those found sleeping in hallways and lobbies may be cited for trespassing.

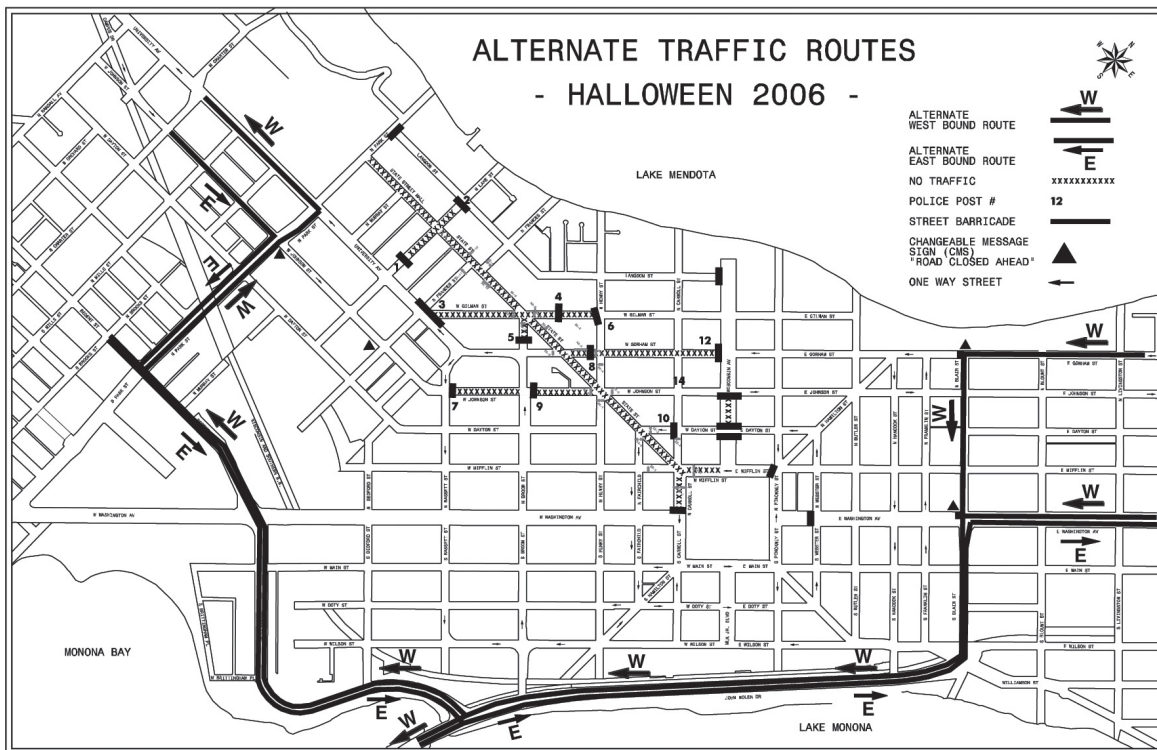
